16-18 Years olds - need a simple yet filling meal

Baked Bean Pot Noodles Soup Spaghetti Bolognese Sauce Tinned fruit Coffee/Tea/Sugar Pasta

Peanut Butter

Sometimes we are able to help with personal hygiene items; toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant

Young Family – often have more facilities and skills for cooking a more complex meal
