
What's New?

CLASS 1

'Space'

This term our learning focus is about Space. We will be learning about Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin as the first men to land on the moon. We will be learning about what it is like to travel and live inside a spaceship! We will learn about the planets and the sun and why the sun is so important for us and for life on Earth.

In our daily Maths, Literacy and Phonics sessions we will follow the Primary National Curriculum and the EYFS curriculum.

Reading: Reading and teaching the skills for reading, continue to be a major focus of our learning. All children should be reading a little every day, this helps children to recognise and learn words by sight, which in turn makes reading easier for them. Both reception and year one children should try to remember to look for places where two letters make one sound, such as 'sh' in shop or 'ch' in chip.



Science: Our topic this half term is link to our topic of Space, learning about the sun and why we need it for plants to grow. We will also be continuing to learn about the seasons.

<u>Helping your child at home</u>: If you want to help your child with their learning at home, you can do this in your everyday activities by noticing and talking about sounds, words, numbers, shapes, colours and time as you go about your daily routines with your children. When out and about, it would help to talk about names of trees, plants and animals and to notice the changes in the seasons, to tie in with our ongoing learning in Science.

<u>PE kits</u> should be kept on your child's peg during the week. They need to have PE kits in school every day. This term sessions will be on Tuesday afternoons with Chris from Pro Coaching.

<u>Leap into Life/Garden Yoga</u>: Pre-school children will also continue to come to the school once a week to take part in our 'Leap in to Life' or Garden Yoga sessions with the Reception children, as part of our PE programme, helping to develop gross motor skills, an essential precursor to developing fine motor skills and writing!

Labels: Please ensure all items of clothing are named and labelled as changing for PE gets very muddled

Parental Involvement for Reception Children: As part of our Assessment and Reporting during the Reception Year, it is important for us to have your input into how your child is doing. Previously we have done this on paper, but this year we have started a using a new online system called Tapestry. You should soon be receiving an email from Tapestry supplying you with a link to set up your own access from home to be able to see photos and comments that we have logged at school and you should also be able to add comments of your own. This should be a lovely way of staying in touch and please bear with us whilst we set this up until it is running smoothly! Thanks.

<u>Transition for September new starters</u>: On Monday afternoons we will continue to do Leap into Life or Garden Yoga with pre-school, afterwards the children who will be starting school in September will come into the classroom and join us for while so that they get to know the school layout and the school staff. We have done this for the past two years to ensure children are comfortable and confident within the school and it has helped them to make a really smooth transition into the Reception year. There are also two 'move up days' in June when the children all visit their new classes for the day; further details on these will follow in the next couple of weeks.

We will also be running some **parent sessions for parents of children due to join us in September**, at the moment we're thinking of running one in June or July to talk about what to expect and address any concerns you may have. Then we will also be running further sessions to talk about how we teach reading and phonics in September. If you have any requests of other areas you'd like discussed please feel free to put forward.

It's in all our best interests for transition to run smoothly and your children to settle well and we're open to suggestions of how we may help each other to achieve this. We will let you know when the sessions are going to be and look forward to meeting you then.

<u>Parents evening</u>: Unfortunately, I wasn't able to run parent consultations last term and I'm aware that the next one is scheduled for July, so, as always, if you have any questions or concerns about how your child is doing please don't hesitate to catch me before or after school or even a phone call if you're unable to come in. CLASS 2

Dear Parents,

Welcome to the Summer Term. As usual, it looks like it's going to be a busy one! Class 2 have started the term enthusiastically and with a great attitude and have already nearly completed their first Literacy topic of the term. So far, they have been writing persuasive letters to convince Mr Gurney to change the school uniform and to convince you to let them walk or cycle to school; I wouldn't be surprised if some of you have heard these ideas already!

Topic

This term our topic is Mountains, Rivers and Coasts. We have started by thinking about how a river forms, learning some river features and looking at specific UK rivers. The class have also created some beautiful water swirl paintings. Over the course of the term, children will learn about how a river is used and why people settle in particular places. We will then move on to looking at major rivers and mountains around the world and the continents which they are in. The class will learn about different animals that live at the coast and the food chains that they are part of.

Homework

Homework will remain the same with work being given out on a Friday to be handed in by Tuesday. Please could you also continue to read with your child as often as possible. All children have their Mathletics login stuck into their homework books and I'd like to encourage children to use this on a regular basis. The website contains lots of different activities for children to complete to support them across the maths curriculum.

Other information

If children wish to keep a drinks bottle in the class to use throughout the day, I would prefer this bottle to contain only water with squash being reserved for lunch times. This is partly to prevent sticky spills but also to help with the health of your child's teeth.

If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to come and speak to me before or after school, or make an appointment through the office.


Aim high - you will be amazed what you can achieve

CLASS 3

Welcome back everyone. The summer is, of course, the final term of the year-although you wouldn't be alone in thinking that this is some way off arriving. I don't doubt that Summer will replace Winter in very short order and then we really will be able to make the most of our beautiful setting. This term promises to be a busy one, as is traditional for this time of year. There will be plenty of events to look forward to, which I am sure will delight and engage the children and provide families with the opportunity to come in to school and celebrate achievements of one kind or another together.

National Tests

We gear up for national tests from the beginning of the term and with your support ensure that the children are test ready. This year, preparations include focused and intensive sessions with me, during the mornings (helped along by incentives of a sugary nature), in addition to small group, adult-led core delivery sessions which are time tabled in the afternoons, as is usual. Mr Gurney will also work with the children to provide an extra boost, where necessary. A joined up approach will enable the children to take each test in their stride and with work with confidence. This will, of course, provide us-yourselves and school- with one part of the bigger picture, because developing the whole child is what is really important to us and remains very much at the heart of all that we accomplish at Bishop Nympton. In the meantime, encourage your children to rest, relax and get plenty of sleep, so that they are mindfully ready for test week, which takes place the week beginning **14th May**. Should you wish to discuss any matters regarding arrangements and how this will affect your child, then please do not hesitate to come in and speak with me.



English

In English we will write around themes covering:

Journalistic writing- The children write a newspaper report to inform others about a crime committed.

Balanced arguments- In class, we will respectfully challenge opinions and debate on some discussion point such as, should children be allowed to wear own clothes? and should children be allowed to vote?

Persuasive formal letter- The children will write a letter of complaint Instructional writing - By the end of this unit of learning children will create a 'how to be a Superhero guide' for any budding superheroes with clear and concise instructions.

Maths

Further develop children's understanding and skills in mental and written calculations including problem and real-life situations. Oral reasoning and collaborative learning activities will be crucial in Maths as well as fluency and speed of basic calculation.

Science

Children will be learning about forensic science, doing investigations carefully and teaching skills they would need to solve a crime. Science stimulates and excites pupils' curiosity about phenomena and events in the world around them. It also satisfies this curiosity with knowledge. Because science links direct practical experience with ideas it can engage learners at many levels. The Scientific method is about developing and evaluating explanations through experimental evidence and modelling. All pupils will learn to question and discuss science-based issues that may affect their own lives. It will also give children the opportunity to immerse themselves in their learning whilst engaging with it at a greater depth.

History

We will be exploring British Crime and Punishment through time. Children will look at:

The Roman legacy- Learning about the impact Roman crime and punishment had on current legal system in Britain.

Anglo- Saxon Laws and Justice - Looking at similarities between roman systems and current

Tudor torture- Looking at crime and punishment during this time period

Dick Turpin- Hero or Villain? The children will write biographies as well as balanced arguments weighing up the evidence for and against Dick Turpin.

CLASS 3 CONT'D

Art

We will be looking at graffiti using ICT creating stencilling. We will also be looking at portraits in the styles of a courtroom artist Martin Shkreli. The children will use different mediums such as charcoal and oil pastel, perfecting how to use them effectively.



L.I.N.E (Learning in the natural environment)

Our productive growing zone is now near completion. Raised beds are in place, composting facilities are in progress and we are ready to have a go at growing some summer salad crops and fruit.

We still require further wood chips / bark to complete the pathways around the zone. If anybody has any spare seeds or young vegetable plants that they are willing to donate to the school then we would be very grateful.

We are edging closer to reaching our end goal in the Green tree school awards as we are aiming for the prestigious Platinum award, the highest accolade there is. To achieve this we will be looking at the world in a very different way and creating some photographic artwork to portray this.

Although the weather is hopefully improving, it is still important that work clothes are provided on a Monday and a Tuesday as we will still be scrabbling around in the dirt. Sun protection will also hopefully be required.

P.E

With the summer season approaching the sporting opportunities increase. Outdoor athletics, biathlons, and football fixtures are already in place with more opportunities on the horizon, not to mention our recently earned tag rugby county final!

Practice for these and a multitude of summer sports will be practiced during P.E sessions on a Monday and a Tuesday. Our intra house sports competition will be in top gear as we aim to find out at the end of the year which house is our best sporting house.
